Subject: Fw: ALAUX 002/21 - AUXILIARY COVID-19 RECONSTITUTION GUIDANCE -
VERSION 2 - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Good Morning D11 Shipmates,

You may or may not have had time to read the revised COVID-19 Reconstitution Guidance (link below), but please do so when you get a chance as it contains a lot of good information.

The one thing that I'd like to communicate to our D11N membership is that we remain under the D11 Reconstitution Plan Phase II at this time and for the foreseeable future. Each District and DIRAUX has the authority to implement this revised national guidance based on risk in their area and currently the risk in our District may be greater than others. That being said, our list of current authorized activities have not changed and we are still not authorized to meet in groups even with this revised national guidance.

Within the updated version of the Auxiliary COVID-19 Reconstitution Guide there is an updated Auxiliary COVID-19 High-Risk Assessment form ANSC-7101. The new form has a spot for members to voluntarily report if they have completed receiving a COVID vaccine.

Members are not to submit any proof of vaccination but may be required to provide proof to an OIA in the future. Members who already have an ANSC-7101 form on file do not need to resubmit unless they have had a change in status from the time the previous form was submitted. A change in status could be a health change, completed COVID vaccination, the member or a household member traveled overseas or the member or a household member were exposed to COVID-19. If a member submits the new form they are to evaluate if they are high risk per the CDC guidance on the form AND then check any other items (exposed to COVID, vaccinated, traveled overseas) that apply in Block 2.

Per current guidance, members that meet the high risk threshold as indicated by the CDC guidance still have to check themselves as high risk for one simple rationale...none of these vaccines are 100% effective and the member still has those high risks conditions.

We will be adding the revised ANSC-7101 form to the District website in place of the existing one.

Our biggest priority is to remain safe for ourselves, our family and friends, and for the Coast Guard. Please be patient and stay the course. We will emerge from this pandemic stronger than ever. I look forward to when we are authorized to resume full duties and we can see each other again.
