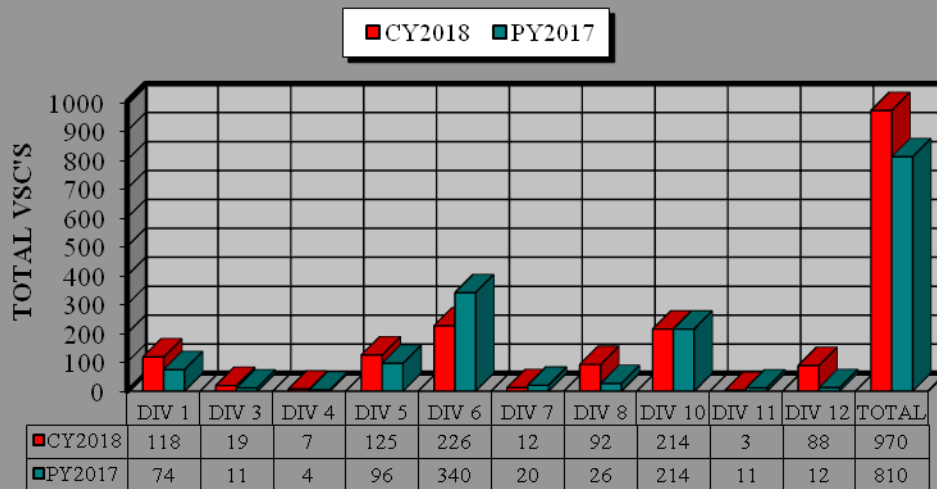

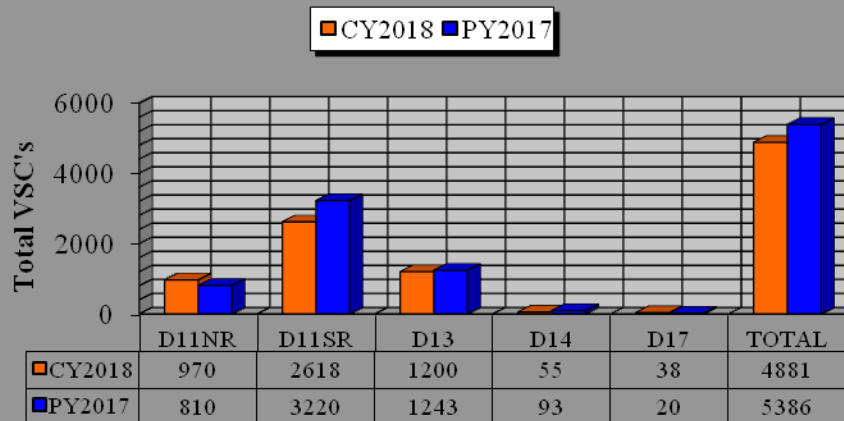
District Statistics*

PAC AREA VSC's Thru April 30, 2018



The 2018 goal for D11NR was 7,500 VSC's. We are 13% of our goal for the year and 119% of 2017 production at this time. The data source is AUXINFO*. Additional stats from AUXINFO* indicates that 821 or 94% have passed the VSC, 346 or 35% are First Time VSC's, and 200 or 20% are High Risk VSC's. In addition 312 Paddlecraft VSC's have been performed, which is approximately 32% of our total VSC production. We currently have 175 Vessel Examiners(VE's)

-These are actual questions from VE Exam Version "F" dated 2014. Answers can be found in another location in the report.

- 1. The color of the 112.5 degrees navigation light would be**
 - a. Red Only.
 - b. Green Only.
 - c. Red or Green.
 - d. White or Yellow.
- 2. Recreational boats with installed heads are required to have:**
 - a. A Type I, II or III MSD if under 65'.
 - b. A dump valve
 - c. A Type III MSD to recirculate waste
 - d. A lock on the head door.

National and District News

National News

-**Just** announced by ANSC and debuted at the recent D/Train is the new "Paddle Tip Reflector Kit" This silver reflectorized sheet includes 4-paddle tip reflectors, and a "Safety Checklist" with a provision for contact information. This adhesive backed sheet is available from ANSC as #3004B in packages of 50 per flotilla. At this time, they are **ONLY** to be used when performing VSC's.

-**The updated** 2018 National Vessel Examiner(VE) workshop has been released and has been posted on the D11NR VE website. Please note, that this is **NOT** a mandatory workshop. It is updated information for 2018 only.

-**Official guidance** in the form of an ALCOAST COMDT NOTICE (ACN) message number 013/18, has been distributed by the Coast Guard. It establishes procedures for the enforcement, examination and inspection procedures for various types of vessels relating to the recall of Walter-Kidde fire extinguishers. The complete ACN can also be found at www.dcms.uscg.mil/General-Messages/ACN/

The following is a summary of those procedures. These procedures are effectively immediately.

1. Educate the owner and/or operator of a vessel with a recalled Kidde fire extinguisher onboard about the recall and replacement process for getting a new fire extinguisher. The recall and replacement procedures can be found at the following websites:

2. Recalled fire extinguishers shall **not** prevent issuance of a VSC decal. Vessel Examiners shall issue a VSC decal to any vessel that receives a VSC in which a recalled fire extinguisher is on board and needed to meet carriage requirements when all other VSC requirements are met IAW Vessel Safety Check Manual, COMDTINST M16796.8A.

3. If a recalled extinguisher is found and fulfills a carriage requirement:

a. The VE shall annotate the VSC form by placing an asterisk and the word "RECALL" next to item 5, Fire Extinguishers, and provide a copy of the recall notice to the vessel owner. NOTE: The Consumer Product Safety Commission recall notice can be found at <https://www.cpsc.gov/Recalls/2017/kidde-recalls-fire-extinguishers-with-plastic-handles-due-to-failure-to-discharge-and> *****

b. Vessel Examiners shall retain a copy of any VSC form annotated pursuant to this message until further notice.

c. Auxiliary vessel examiners shall inform anyone requesting a VSC of the recall and the prudence in replacing recalled fire extinguishers.

-**A new** incentive for VSC production was announced at D/Train! A nicely engraved pen/flashlight/styluses will be mailed DIRECTLY to the 1st 50 Vessel Examiners to reach 40 VSC's! Be one of the 1st in your flotilla to receive to special recognition!

-**Just** a reminder, per the 2015 Vessel Examiner (VE) workshop, paddlecraft VSC's DO NOT count toward the initial VE qualification or requalification. The VSC may be performed a sailboat, powerboat or PWC.

-**For** Coast Guard liability insurance purposes, **PRIOR** to leaving the house for **ANY** VSC activity other than to participate at an organized station, **PLEASE** remember to notify a member of the flotilla leadership (FC, VFC, and FSO-VE) of your planned activity.

The notification could be in the form of an email, text message or a phone call. In the unlikely event of an incident, be prepared to provide proof of the notification. In addition, per the new VSC Manual please remember, you also need to be in uniform and if boarding a vessel you need to be wearing a lifejacket.

-PLEASE do NOT wear boots to climb aboard a vessel to perform a VSC. Our program allows for deck shoes, white or black tennis/walking with soft soles. If this is not an option, please consider purchasing disposal shoe/boot covers available in the paint or hardware dept. at Wal-Mart, Lowes, Home Depot, etc, a package of 6 for under \$10.

-VSC's ON RENTALS-At the request of Commodore Collins, to maintain uniformity in the VSC program, moving forward, **ALL** VSC's for rental agencies that rent pwc's, fishing boats, houseboats, paddlecraft, etc. will now require a D11NR Rental Agreement with the dealer. This program is relatively simple, straightforward, and is self-explanatory. You can find a copy of the instructions (ML-1), a sample introduction letter (ML-2), and a copy of the agreement (ML-3) on the D11NR Vessel Examiner (VE) website:

<http://rbsafety.d11nuscgaux.info/ve/ve.html> under "**VE FORMS**". These are done in Microsoft "Word" and you can tailor them for your individual needs. Please note that to participate in this program, a Program Visitor (PV) is required. However, if you are a Vessel Examiner (VE) and a current Program Visitor (PV), you can fulfill that requirement. Please print (2) copies-one for you to keep after signed by the vendor, and one for the vendor to keep after you and the Program Visitor (PV) have signed it. You should maintain your copies for the calendar year.

-A special request from the Director's office; PLEASE have the qualifying members 7038 with the 5 VSC's entered into AUXDATA by the FSO/SO-IS **PRIOR** to submission of the MT-2 to the Director's office.
